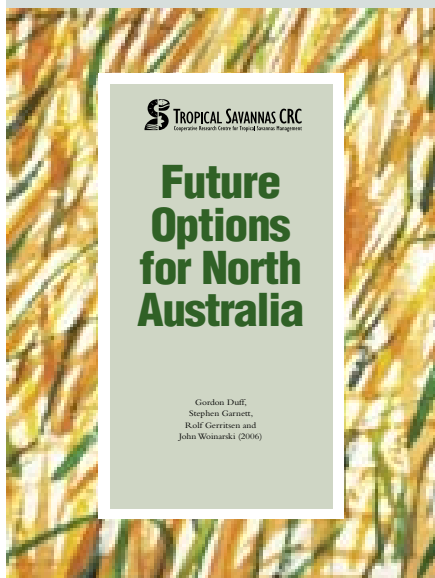


Future Options for North Australia



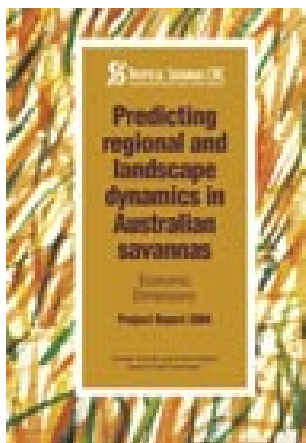
Gordon Duff, Stephen Garnett, Rolf Gerritsen and John Woinarski (2006)

For each driver the level of uncertainty is assessed as is the extent to which they can be influenced by people living in the region. The seven scenarios developed under the influence of the different drivers are dire or desirable depending on decisions we make in the near future.

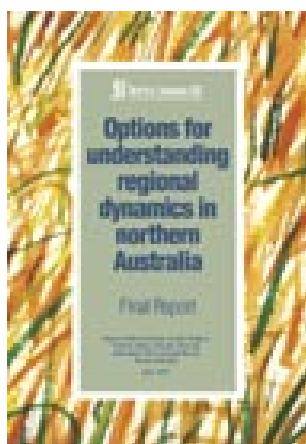

Options for Understanding Regional Dynamics in Northern Australia

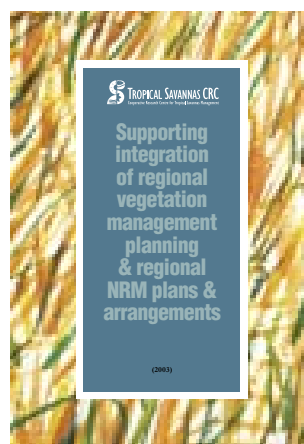

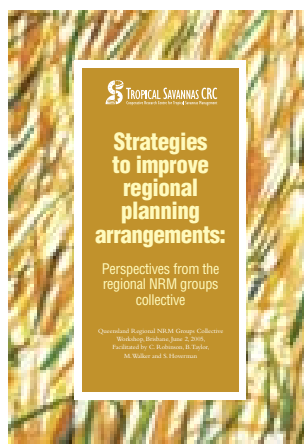

Strategies to improve regional planning arrangements: Perspectives from the regional NRM groups collective

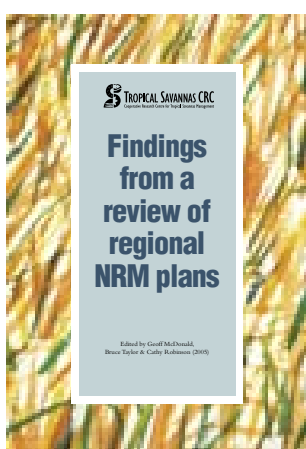

Criteria and Methods for evaluating regional plans in tropical savanna regions

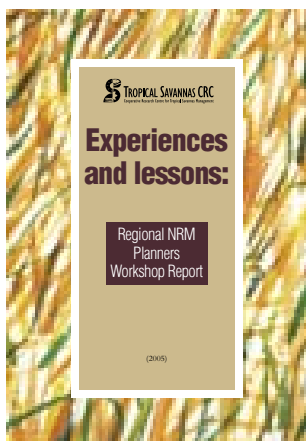
